


ABOUTUS

As many as 50+ young performers in Grades 1-12 have created and performed in ADT's annual dance productions. Children's literature provides the basis for the script and original music is commissioned. As a result, a rich tradition has been established that provides imaginative, engaging and affordable family entertainment to Calgarians. Works of the company have also been performed around the world in Brazil and The Netherlands, and province-wide in Edmonton, Banff and Lethbridge.

Each spring, Alberta Dance Theatre holds open call placement auditions inviting dancers from around the city of Calgary to join the company. ADT welcomes dancers of all experience levels and uses the auditions as a way to place the dancers in the appropriate performance group.

ABOUT THE SHOW

Spoilers ahead!

The show you are about to see weaves together dance and acting to tell the story of The Secret Starling by Judith Eagle. We've included a recap of the show below to help you follow along but there are spoilers. If you want to keep the show a surprise skip this page!

Since our show is only 1 hour and 15 minutes we couldn't include every detail from the book.

We highly suggest you read the novel to fully discover the world that enchanted us!

Clara Starling lives with her Uncle, Edward Starling, and their friendly Cook in the crumbling Braithwaite Manor. Her Uncle is very strict and keeps the exact same routine day in and day out. Clara is bored. However, everything changes one day when the Cook is fired, her Uncle disappears and she is left in the cold Manor, even more lonely than before. It would appear her Uncle has severe debts and is selling Braithwaite Manor. Clara doesn't know what she is supposed to do. Until a boy shows up on her doorstep!

The boy's name is Peter. He is friendly, energetic and has a never ending passion for Ballet! Peter also brings his curious cat, named Stockwell, along! Peter and Clara develop a deep friendship and share stories from their past with each other. As a baby Peter was found at a train station by a kind woman named Elsa Trimble. Peter calls her Granny, and though not related by blood, they are family. Unfortunately, Granny is sick. One of Peter's kind neighbours named Stella sent Peter away to live with their friend Uncle Edward. Except neither Peter or Clara know where Uncle went.

Things get complicated when Mr. and Mrs. Morden show up at Braithwaite Manor. They want to buy the Manor and turn it into The Home For Unwanted Children. Peter and Clara are even included in the sale! Luckily they are allergic to cats and Stockwell is able to drive them off! Almost as soon as the Morden's leave another mysterious stranger arrives. Clara and Peter are able to narrowly avoid their notice.

Peter and Clara's days become even more interesting when they find a ballet shoe! Clara has never danced before, and as far as she knows, no one in her family has done anything as fun or exciting as dancing. The mystery of the ballet shoe begins! Peter and Clara are joined by the friendly neighbourhood kids and they take a trip to the nearest city of Leeds to visit a department store and find out more about the ballet Shoe. They find out that the shoe belongs to none other than Clara's Mom! The Shop Owner lets them know that Clara's Mom was actually a famous ballerina, right on the brink of becoming a star, but died tragically, and unexpectedly, while performing the ballet Swan Lake.

When the two kids return home they find Peter's neighbour, Stella, at Braithwaite Manor. She seems friendly and very put together! Clara wants to immediately trust this capable adult who could help her find her Uncle ... that is until Stella locks both the kids in the highest tower of Braithwaite Manor! Stella is definitely suspicious and colluding with Uncle Edward. A daring escape ensues!

Clara and Peter have to learn more about Christobel Starling, so they head to the busy city of London followed by the very mysterious stranger! It doesn't take long for Peter to notice there is a famous Ballet company presenting works from the Choreographer Mr. Nureyev.



Peter and Clara head to the Newspaper Library where they find Christobel Starling's obituary. The obituary doesn't mention a child at all. Clara was always told her mother died while giving birth to her. Clara feels invisible, confused, and wonders what else her Uncle lied about.

The obituary does mention a fellow dancer named Sergei Ivanov who may be Clara's father! Peter is quick to point out that Sergei might not know he had a child and may really want to meet Clara. The kids vow to visit the Ballet Company that is in town after visiting Peter's Granny. A neighbour lets them know Granny is in the hospital! The Doctors have discovered Granny has been poisoned.

Peter is very worried about Granny and doesn't want to leave the hospital but they are told Granny is strong and will get better after some rest. While they wait for Granny's recovery Peter and Clara head to the Ballet Company to meet Sergei Ivanov. Instead they run into Mr. Nureyev!

Mr. Nureyev knows Sergei Ivanov! Not only that but Sergei is performing that night in the Ballet! Peter and Clara convince Mr. Nureyev to give him a message. They just have to wait until after the show.

While they wait Peter and Clara read the history of the Ballet Company and notice a picture with a very familiar face! It's Stella! Except the Ballet Company is calling her Svetlana Markova. After Christobel's death, by poison, Svetlana took over all of her roles at the Ballet Company.

Peter and Clara are blown away! Stella must have poisoned Christobel and Granny! She is a selfish criminal!

Unfortunately it's right then that Mr. and Mrs. Morden show up again and capture Peter! Once again Clara and Peter find themselves locked away in the highest tower of Braithwaite Manor. They repeat their daring escape only to find the mysterious stranger is waiting for them ... with Uncle Edward and Stella!

The stranger is Jackson Smith, a Private Investigator, who was hired by Granny to find out more about Peter's past. Jackson Smith discovered that Peter and Clara are twins! Christobel Starling left Stella in charge of the wellbeing of both children until their father could be found. Stella of course tried to get more out of the bargain and convinced the Uncle to participate. Uncle Edward was the one who left Peter at the trainstation as a baby. In his defense all the bags did look the same. And that's why you don't put baby's in a bag.

The twins are re-united with their father Sergei Ivanov, which according to Christobel Starling's Will, means that Stella is no longer the guardian of the children. Stella and the Uncle are arrested. Clara is finally able to look at her new found family that includes the neighbourhood kids, Cook, and Granny. She realizes how colourful her life really is!



Tanisi Sinha


Tanisi is nine years old and this is her first year of ADT! She is in grade 5 and loves art! She likes tea and loves animals. Tanisi likes camping and field trips.
